C.E.R.T. members are trained to respond to and cope with the aftermath of a disaster by providing light search and rescue, basic medical care, put out small fires, and organize into an effective group of volunteers. NICK RESENDEZ	(310) 847-8385		<p>Community Emergency Response Team's (CERT) are formed by members of a neighborhood or work place who want to be better prepared for the hazards that threaten their communities.</p> <p>Initially, CERT programs were developed to assist communities in taking care of themselves in the aftermath of a major disaster when first responders are overwhelmed or unable to respond because of communication or transportation difficulties. As the CERT concept has taken hold across the country, however, CERT's have become much more than originally envisioned. CERT's have proven themselves to be an active and vital part of the communities' preparedness and response capability. For example, CERT's have been used to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Distribute and/or install smoke detectors and batteries to the elderly and/or disabled * Assist with evacuations and traffic control * Promote community awareness of potential hazards and preparedness measures * Supplement staffing at special events such as parades * Act as victims in training exercises <p>The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program is an all-risk, all-hazard training. Do you and your family have a plan and emergency supplies? Does your neighborhood block? Do you know how and when to shut off your utilities? How to provide first aid to your family and neighbors?</p> <p>The Palos Verdes Peninsula Community Emergency Response Team (PVP CERT) program is an all risk, all-hazard training. This valuable course is designed to help protect your family, your neighbors and your neighborhood in an emergency situation.</p> <p>The CERT course is taugt in or near the community by a trained team of first responders who have completed a CERT Train-the -Trainer course conducted by their state training office for emergency management, or FEMA's Emergency Management Institute. CERT members receive 20 hours (one day a week for seven weeks or three consecutive Saturdays) of initial training. CERT members maintain and refine their skill by participating in exercises and activities. They can attend supplemental training opportunities offered by the sponsoring agency and others for their skill base.</p>
